## **Assessment Policy (Session 2018-19) for Class VI-VIII**

- Assessment for the year is done in two terms, namely, Term I and Term II.
- Term-I is from April to September and Term-II is from October to March.
- In each term, each scholastic subject is assessed for 100 marks.

### **1. Scholastic Subjects:**

### **Term-I (100 marks)**

#### **A. Periodic Assessment—20 Marks: It would comprise of:**

- Pre Mid-Term Test (10 Marks)** - Syllabus covered till test dates are announced by the school.
- Note book Submission (5 Marks)** - At the end of each term
  - Subject wise notebook performance and record to be maintained by the subject teacher.
  - Regularity, punctuality, neatness and notebook upkeep to be assessed.
- Subject Enrichment Activities (5 Marks)** - Respective subject teachers of each scholastic subject will conduct these activities and maintain records. There shall be at least one activity per subject per term.

#### **B. Mid Term (Half Yearly Exam): 80 Marks**

Written Exam for 80 Marks in each scholastic subject with syllabus covered till Half Yearly Exam dates are announced by the school.

### **Term-II (100 marks)**

#### **A. Post Mid-Term Periodic Assessment: 20 Marks (same as Term I)**

#### **B. Yearly Exam: 80 Marks** Written Exam for 80 Marks with syllabus coverage as follows:

- Class VI : 10% of 1<sup>st</sup> term covering significant topics + entire syllabus of term 2  
Class VII : 20% of 1<sup>st</sup> term covering significant topics + entire syllabus of term 2  
Class VIII : 30% of 1<sup>st</sup> term covering significant topics + entire syllabus of term 2

## 2. Co-Scholastic Activities

Meant to encourage the holistic development of the student, students' performance would be graded on a **3- point grading scale (A to C)**. There will be no descriptive indicators & no upscaling of grades.

- i) Work Education (skill based activities resulting in goods or services useful to the community)
- ii) Art Education (Visual & Performing Arts)
- iii) Health and Physical Education (Sports / Martial Arts / Yoga / NCC etc.)

## 3. Discipline


Intended to enable students become desirable human beings. Students' performance in discipline would be assessed by the respective class teachers on Attendance, Sincerity, Behavior, and Values on a **3- point grading scale (A to C)** with no descriptive indicators & no up scaling of grades.


### Note:


- A student must put in a minimum of 75 % attendance during the academic year and clear all the arrears of fee and other dues to appear in the Annual Examination.
- In case a student is likely to be absent for any test or exam, the parents should seek prior written permission. In case of illness, doctor's certificate must be submitted along with the leave letter.
- A student who has absented himself from any test / examination will not be considered for any award / prize on overall performance.
- No retest is taken for students participating in school-based activities (Sports, Visual and Performing Arts, etc.) or for absence due to medical reasons.
- Students joining the school late/mid term shall submit details of attendance, result, etc. from the previous school.

### Promotion Policy

A student will be eligible for promotion only if he/ she secures minimum 33% marks in all scholastic subjects individually and in aggregate and at least grade C in all non-scholastic subjects.
