On December 10th, 2023, a session titled 'How Traditions Serve the Economy' was held. The newly appointed members of the Ted-Ed club introduced the topic, and the members began to discuss it.


Members stated that the festival goods created on a small scale boost employment in a country like India, which is largely populated and often faced by challenges of disguised unemployment.

An example of handicrafts was talked about. Handicrafts have helped in blooming the culture as well as generating money, and at grand Indian weddings, rich traditions and rituals add to the economy. It was expressed that tourism and culture also go hand in hand. The holy places and traditions of the country attract millions of tourists and visitors annually, hence increasing the GDP.

The discussion escalated when a member said that traditions somewhere hinder the economy, as some cultures have a tradition of not allowing women to work and some castes are only limited to a specific job. This has come to a change as the mindset is changing. But along with modernization come traditions that are not valued or forgotten. Core values that come with the deep rooted traditions are getting pruned; values like punctuality and honesty are being affected. It was also stated that many expensive large-scale festival goods are not produced in India but in foreign countries, hence contributing to their GDP.

The session concluded with the mutual understanding of all the members that the government should produce huge scale cultural products and take effective measures to promote Indian goods, and as we modernize, we should be deeply rooted in our traditions and culture.







## Has Cancel Culture gone too far ?

The discussion session on the topic "Has the cancel culture gone too far?" was on December 18, 2023.

The session commenced with one of the members briefly introducing the topic and explaining the prevalence of call-out culture in modern times.

Many members then voiced their opinions on the aforesaid topic and discussed how they had witnessed the cruelty of cancel culture by talking about some reallife examples, or, one can say, victims of cancel culture. Members even spoke about the emotionally charged nature of boycotts, pointing to the example of comedians experiencing a backlash for jokes on sensitive topics. Members also raised questions regarding the need for a comedian boycott, arguing that jokes should be seen solely as humorous.

discussion expanded to the broader impact on regular people's lives, with participants talking about how such boycotts might be propelled by misleading information. Concerns were raised that these movements could redirect attention away from crucial issues.

The interaction focused on an in-depth conversation that covered the emotional implications of boycotts, the role of comedians in society, and the potential consequences for both artists and the general audience.







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




The what if session was held on the topic "WHAT IF PARALLEL UNIVERSES EXIST?" On December 23, 2023.
