SCHEME OF ASSESSMENT PATTERN AND PROMOTION POLICY (2024-25) CLASSES: VI - VIII

Assessment of classes 6 and 7 will be done on the same examination pattern as of class 8 and students of class 6 and 7 will not be held back in the same class.

Academic Session for classes VI to Vlll will have assessment as Periodic Tests (July \& October), Mid-Term Examinations (August / September) \& Annual Examinations (February/March).

Pen and paper examination of classes VI to VIII will be conducted. These examinations will test the achievements of basic learning outcomes. A summary of the analysis of class wise and subject wise results shall be prepared and kept in record to serve as an input for academic enrichment and remedial purpose.

Fraction of the marks will be rounded off as per mathematical formula in all the subjects and classes, for example: 8.1 to 8.4 will be rounded off to 8.0 and 8.5 to 8.9 rounded off to 9.0 .

## Subject Enrichment - 5 marks

These activities are defined as activities leading to experiential learning integrated with each subject and leading to subject enrichment of the student. They shall be engaged in activities based on content that connects different areas of knowledge, application and values with their own lives and the world around.

## Project Based Activities - 5 marks

These activities are instructional approaches designed to give students the opportunity to develop knowledge and skills through engaging projects set around challenges and problems they may face in the real world. Project Based Activities provide an opportunity for students to engage deeply with the targeted content with a focus on long-term retention. These activities facilitate the development of key skills like: Identification of Problems, Logical Thinking, Creativity, Inference Making and Problem Solving.

## Portfolio - 5 marks

The Portfolio is to broaden the scope of learning and achieve diverse curriculum outcomes by examining a range of evidence of student performances being assessed.
It is a purposeful collection of intentionally chosen student's work representing a selection of performances that is assembled over time and describes the learner's efforts, progress, growth and achievement in key areas learning outcomes. It is a tool for assessing a variety of skills not usually testable in a single setting of the traditional written paper and pencil tests.

## Multiple Assessment - 5 marks

Multiple Assessment is aimed at evaluating the performance of the learner more comprehensively \& regularly and provide schools/ teachers flexibility to use multiple and diverse techniques to assess learners viz. observation, oral tests, individual or group work, class discussion, quizzes, concept maps, exit cards, visual expressions, listening and speaking skills etc. as per the demand of the subject and the context towards addressing the goal of assessment for and as learning.

## Periodic Tests - 5 marks

Periodic Tests will be conducted at school level in the first two periods, pattern of which will be same as term end examination. NO RETEST will be conducted for Periodic Tests.

## Co-scholastic Activities:

Co-Scholastic Activities will be graded before the end of the Mid-Term Exam and Annual Exam on a 3-point scale:

A-OUTSTANDING B -VERY GOOD C - GOOD
The parameters for assessing Co-curricular activities are:

- Regularity
- Sincere Participation
- Output and teamwork

The co-curricular activities covered will be:

- Work Education refers to skill-based activity: Information and Communication Technology (Theory and Practical)
- Visual Art refers to Art Education
- Performing Art refers to one of the following: Instrumental Music/ Vocal Music/ Dance/Dramatics.
- Physical Education refers to Games \& Sports
- Yoga
- General Knowledge


## Promotion Guidelines:

If a student of class 6 or 7 is not eligible to be declared "Pass" s/he will be declared "Promoted as per RTE" at the end of the session of a class provided.

## Passing Criteria for Class VIII :

In order to be declared 'Pass' at the end of the session for promotion to the next higher class, a student must secure at least $33 \%$ marks in each subject i.e., 33 out of 100 in each subject studied by him/her during the session.

The promotion to the next higher class will also be subject to the condition that a minimum of $25 \%$ marks be scored in each subject in the Annual Examination i.e., 13 marks out of 50.

A candidate not eligible to be declared "Pass" will be declared "Promoted with grace marks" at the end of the session of a class provided $s / h e$ is entitled to grace marks.

Grace marks up to maximum of 10 in any two subjects, shall be awarded to a student to reach the minimum required $33 \%$ of marks in each subject.

- Provided that a minimum of $25 \%$ of marks are secured in each subject in the Annual Examination i.e., 13 marks out of 50 Marks to make him/her eligible for promotion.
- Provided that $\mathrm{s} /$ he does not require more than 05 marks in one. subject to come up to the minimum required of $33 \%$ of marks in that subject.

If a student of class 8 is not eligible to be declared pass s/he will be detained in the same class as per the notification by the Education Department of Maharashtra.

## PROMOTION POLICY AND CUMULATIVE RESULT

1. In order to be declared as having passed the class IX examination, the student must have obtained 33 marks in the aggregate and $33 \%$ in each subject.
2. According to CBSE circular no. CBSE/AS (COORD)/IA/X/2020, dated 31.01.2020, In the scholastic area, a student needs to secure overall 33\% marks (both Pen Paper Test \& Internal Assessment taken together) (i.e D Grade) to be able to pass that subject.
3. A student scoring less than $33 \%$ (i.e E grade) in more than 2 subjects will be detained. Retest is permitted in a maximum of 2 subjects only.

## Missed Test / Exams

A) If a student has missed any exam (except for points mentioned in (B) underneath), no average shall be given i.e., the student will be marked zero and there will be no retest.
B) If a student is On Duty or has missed the PT 1/PT 2 due to genuine medical reasons, retest shall be conducted only once in second term and shall be held as per the declared schedule. The missed PTs on account of the above-mentioned reasons will be marked on the basis of Term exam performance.
C) Use of unfair means

Strict Disciplinary action will be taken against the students using unfair means. Their answer scripts will be canceled and no extra time will be given. Only a new answer script will be assessed. Repeated unfair means will invite major penalization.

## PASS CRITERIA FOR CLASS XI

In order to be declared as having passed the Class XI Examination, the student must have obtained:
A. A minimum of $33 \%$ marks in Theory Cumulative total and $33 \%$ in Practical

INDIVIDUALLY for all the subjects
B. A school to have 3 rounds of Unit Tests. Best two of the three unit tests will be considered for the cumulative assessment.

Wherein Theory Cumulative total is computed as follows:

- 20\% of UT (Best two of three)
- 20\% of HALF YEARLY
- 60\% of ANNUAL EXAMINATION

The numerical sum of the above weighted scores will be converted on a base of 80/70/60/40/30 as per the CBSE norms for that specific subject theory component.
C. Minimum subject wise score of $33 \%$ in Annual Examination

Both these criteria (A and B) must be fulfilled for a child to be declared passed and promoted.

## ELIGIBILITY FOR RETEST IN CLASS 11 / DETENTION:

A) A candidate obtaining less than $33 \%$ in one subject only will qualify for a retest in the specific subject.
B) A candidate securing less than $33 \%$ in the retest shall be detained. In case of detention, no change of subject is permitted.
C) A candidate obtaining less than $33 \%$ in two or more subjects will be detained. In case of detention, no change of subject is permitted.

## MISSED/RETEST EXAMS

A) If a student has missed any exam (except for points mentioned in $B \in C$ underneath), no average shall be given i.e. the student will be marked zero and there will be no retest.
B) If a student is On Duty or has missed the Annual exam due to genuine medical reasons, retest shall be conducted only once and shall be held as per the declared schedule.
C) If a student is On Duty, new admission or has missed the Half Yearly exam due to genuine medical reasons, proportionate marks may be awarded.

## USE OF UNFAIR MEANS

Strict Disciplinary action will be taken against the students using unfair means. Their answer scripts will be canceled and no extra time will be given. Only a new answer script will be assessed. Repeated unfair means will invite major penalization.
